Eligibility: Per IC 12-10-3-2 An endangered adult is anyone over the age of 18 who is incapable by reason of mental illness, mental retardation, dementia, habitual drunkenness, excessive use of drugs, or other physical or mental incapacity of managing or directing the management of the individual's property or providing or directing the provision of self-care and is harmed or threatened with harm as a result of: neglect, battery or exploitation. An individual is not an endangered adult solely: for the reason that the individual is being provided spiritual treatment in accordance with a recognized religious method of healing instead of specified medical treatment if the individual would not be considered to be an endangered adult if the individual were receiving the medical treatment; or on the basis of being physically unable to provide self care when appropriate care is being provided.

Additional Information: You will find more information about our program and resource links at www.tippecanoe.in.gov/prosecutor. APS also has a duty to report law that is similar to the one Child Protective Services has.

Adult Protective Services: Investigate allegations of battery, neglect, self-neglect or exploitation of endangered adults in accordance with IC 12-10-3-2. Short term Case Management until the client is no longer in danger is also provided. Presentations to local agencies can also be scheduled.

Through educational programs and youth activities, the Bauer Community Center acts as a resource to connect children and families with the essential necessities and training for long-term change. Women in Christ United Food Pantry open Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday 12 p.m. – 2:30 p.m., also Thursdays 4 – 6 p.m. Available to Tippecanoe County residents once every 30 days. Other programs include Community Partners, a free and voluntary emergency assistance program,

and the Youth Development Program, a free drop in program for youth ages 5 – 18 years old. Please note that 5 year olds must be enrolled and currently attending Kindergarten.

Bauer Early Care and Education

Bauer Family Resources operates Tippecanoe County's federally-funded, community –based Head Start program. The program promotes school readiness by enhancing the social, cognitive, language, and physical development of children ages 6 weeks to age 5 and pregnant women. This is accomplished through the provision of educational, health, nutritional, social and other services to the enrolled children and families.

Families of children age 6 weeks to 35 months may qualify for either the Home-based program or the full-day Center-Based program. 3 year old children are placed in our half-day preschool program and 4 year olds heading to kindergarten in the fall are placed in our full-day prekindergarten classroom.

The Pregnant Women's Program provides a foundation for pregnancy care, labor, & parenting. The program serves pregnant women and fathers or support people during the duration of the pregnancy and up to 6 weeks after the birth of the child. In addition, the program offers participants weekly education class and support, a referral program for men to the fatherhood program, monthly home visits to set goals and discuss intimate issues for mom, and priority for the child into child care with Early Head Start.

All of our early education programs engage parents in their child's learning and assist the parents in attaining their educational, literacy and employment goals.
